Susan holds a Master of Public Health with a concentration in Leadership, Management and Policy from the University of Cincinnati, a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from the University of Cincinnati and a Bachelor of Arts from Oberlin College, where she majored in Russian studies.

Susan previously worked as an independent public health consultant. She supported Interact's community research program and worked with the Cincinnati Health Department as project manager for the Ohio Institute for Equity in Birth Outcomes. She had also contracted with the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), where she received a Fiscal Year 2014 Performance Award and was a Spotlight on Excellence winner.

She was a licensed midwife providing clinical care to mothers and families, and served on the Washington state midwifery board. Susan had previously spent several years in Boulder, Colo., at the Center for Human Rights Advocacy, producing quarterly seminars in Russia and Ukraine about how to integrate human rights into a criminal justice system.
